World of Walkable Art: Fairfield





Hospital/Melville Area

Park in Manning/Hammond/Fow Sts off Palmerston St and meet at the tennis courts.

- Note Jeremy's bus shelter outside the tennis courts.
- Proceed into Hammond St, which becomes Horne St.
- Cross the road and take Tidd St on the right which leads up to Pembroke St.
- Turn left into Pembroke, cross the road to the lake side, and head towards the hospital, noticing Jeremy's bus stop on the corner near Selwyn St.
- Continue on, crossing Lake Rd intersection with care and proceed to the major intersection at Kahikatea Drive. At Braemar Hospital, note Jeremy's bus shelter.
- Cross over at the lights to Lorne St on the hospital side of Ohaupo Rd.
- Proceed down Lorne St and cross at the lights. Head straight down Bader St to see Jeremy's murals on the
 walls of the Bader St shopping centre, and the graffiti art panels on the far end wall of the shops. Head
 further down Bader St to check out Jeremy's "Melville" mural near the school and the bus shelter across
 from Pine Avenue.
- Retrace your steps to the lights and head into Melville Park. Note Jeremy's murals on the front and sides of the Dog Obedience Club.
- Carry on down through Melville Park past the Skating Rink and cross Cobham Drive to the river path, with EXTREME CAUTION at the uncontrolled crossing on the slip lane at the Normandy Ave intersection.
- Head to the left along the river path and follow it right back to the boat ramp opposite Radnor St. Take time to admire Jeremy's Exeloo (with fish!) at the Fishing Club rooms at the bottom of Radnor St on the river bank path.
- Cross with caution and proceed slowly and steadily up one of Hamilton's steepest streets to emerge in Anglesea St.
- Turn left into Anglesea then right into Palmerston St to return to our starting point.
