New Zealand's National Walking Awards 2010

The Judges will be looking at how accessibility has been considered in the planning and implementation of each project. All nominations must be for a Project or Promotion undertaken over the last 12 months between 1 July 2009 and 30 June 2010

The New Zealand Best Practice Walking Facility

This Golden Foot Award is for the best significant walking infrastructure, completed within the last 12 months, which shows innovation to overcome barriers to walking. Applicants will need to show evidence of growth in walking numbers as a result of the facility. Accessibility and urban design quality will be key attributes of the facility.

Top Commitment to Walking by a New Zealand Organisation

This $Golden\ Foot\ Award$ is for an organisation of any size which has, over the last 12 months, shown a strong commitment to furthering walking in New Zealand. They will need to show how they have been successful in supporting walking, advocating for walkers' needs, and encouraging a change in travel choice towards walking.

Best New Zealand Walking Promotion

This Golden Foot Award is for a successful promotion or event, which has raised public awareness, encouraged a positive attitude, and celebrated walking as an everyday activity and means of transport. Applicants will need to show how their promotion has improved walker numbers, or produced a change in behaviours as a result of the promotion.

Best New Zealand Small Walking Project

This $Golden\ Foot\ Award$ recognises the huge contribution made by small groups around New Zealand, achieving great things on a shoestring budget. The award is for any project with a total budget of \$5,000 or less, that has made a significant difference to walking in their area.
