Living Streets Aotearoa supports the New Zealand Transport Agency's announcement of Napier Hastings and New Plymouth as the two target Model Communities. The injection of \$7.5 million into funding walking and cycling facilities in these communities will significantly enhance walking as a transport mode creating healthy communities.

"This is a fantastic outcome for all Napier/Hastings and New Plymouth walkers. Walking is the first mode of travel we all learn and the last one we want to give up." says Peter Kortegast Living Streets Aotearoa President. "It is an exciting opportunity for Napier/Hastings and New Plymouth. Becoming a walking and cycling city will boost tourism in both regions and is well timed to leverage off the upcoming Rugby World Cup 2011."
