Creating quality parks and reserves: Newlands, Paparangi, Grenada Village and Woodridge

Living Streets Wellington supports the principles that appear to have been applied in looking at these parks, notably the needs to:

- ensure that there are adequate green spaces and informal recreational facilities near all residences in the suburbs, so that parents and their children can easily walk to these areas
- ensure that play areas can be accessed by a parent with a pram or pushchair
- have clear signposting of parks, so residents know that the spaces are public land
- ensure that parks feel safe, by providing visibility from surrounding areas
- provide for a range of uses of the parks, including children's play areas and "kick around" spaces
- provide enhanced walkway connections between parts of the suburb and between green spaces

In relation to signposting of walking routes, we recommend that there should be a map in addition to information about what road is reached by a walkway. This will assist people who may not know the names of the streets in another part of the suburb, particularly where the walkway exits in a small noexit street.

Living Streets Wellington supports the proposals, and encourages the council to implement the improvements as soon as possible.
